## SANTA FE COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENTS

- SFCC enrolls more than 8,500 individual students in credit classes every year, about 5,400 of them each term. Of these, 40% are seeking a degree, certificate, letter of qualification (LOQ) or professional certificate.
- Enrollments also include more than 2,500 individual students in noncredit continuing education classes each year, about 1,600 of them each term.
- Adult Basic Education at SFCC enrolls more than 1,800 each year.
- More than 200 high school students take classes in our dual credit program each term.
- On average, 40% of all students enrolled in financial-aid eligible programs receive some form of financial aid.
- In fall 2007, minority students made up 43% of all credit students and 54% of all degree/certificate/LOQ-seeking students. Hispanic students made up 37% of all credit students, and 48% of all degree/certificate/LOQ-seeking students.
- About 82% of all SFCC credit students are residents of the Santa Fe Taxing District.
- In 2006-2007, 80% of the FY 04-05 graduates of SFCC were either employed in a job included in the Department of Labor's (DOL) count or enrolled in school in New Mexico. (DOL data excludes persons in the military, the self-employed, and those employed outside of New Mexico).

## ACADEMICS and CAREERS

- SFCC offers 59 degree and certificate programs;
  - 12 Associate in Arts degrees;
  - 4 Associate in Science degrees;
  - 1 Associate in Applied Arts degrees;
  - 14 Associate in Applied Science degrees;
  - 25 Certificates; 10 Letters of Qualification (LOQs)
- SFCC offers Teacher Certification courses in five areas for students already possessing a Bachelor's Degree: Early Childhood Education; Elementary Education; Secondary Education; Special Education; and Bilingual Education Endorsement.
- On average, 97% of SFCC nursing students who take the NCLEX exam pass it; no less than 95% on the first try.
- 97.6% of students sitting for the Teacher Assessment Exam passed over the past 3 years, exceeding state averages in all areas.
- SFCC offers programs on campus, on line, at off-campus locations and in partnership with other two and four year institutions.
- SFCC has outstanding regionally recognized programs in Fine Woodworking, Media Arts, Fine Arts and Film. Its Culinary Arts Program recently entered into a collaboration with Trident Technical College of Charleston, South Carolina for student and teaching exchanges.
- SFCC partners with UNM and NMHU to offer Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programs on the SFCC campus. Programs include Education, Business, Fine Arts, Counseling and Public Administration.



## FINANCIAL IMPACT

- SFCC's annual Instructional and General (I&G) Budget is \$25.1M
- SFCC receives its I&G revenue from the following sources:
  - 15% Tuition and Fees
  - 40% State Appropriations
  - 44% Local Taxes
  - 1% Other
- SFCC spends its I&G budget in the following way:
  - 50.1% Instruction
  - 10% Academic Support
  - 9.4% Student Services
  - 18.5% Institutional Support
  - 12% Operations and Maintenance of Plant
- In FY 06-07 SFCC received over \$8.3M in grant dollars from federal, state, local and private sources to assist students with scholarships, loans and services including tutoring, advising, career services and counseling.
- More than 274 full-time and 587 part-time employees work at SFCC. The college's annual payroll is \$18M.
- Capital projects totaling \$7.5M have been completed over the past three years, including the construction of a new swimming pool. The college is currently seeking funding for an estimated \$8.2M Allied Health Building to house current and future Health Education Programs to serve Santa Fe County and other northern New Mexico students.
- In the FY 06-07, SFCC distributed a total of over \$2.48M in student financial aid in the form of grants, scholarships and work study.

## COMMUNITY SERVICE

- More than 850 SFCC students volunteered more than 55,000 hours in nonprofit agencies throughout Santa Fe as part of the college's Service-Learning Program last year.
- Students who enrolled in a special SFCC accounting class and were certified by the IRS to prepare tax returns helped more than 5,000 low-income residents, senior citizens and others last year through Tax Help New Mexico.
- More than 3,300 appointments are made annually for Medicaid and Project Ann clients to receive dental care through the SFCC Dental Clinic.
- College employees donated \$18,987 last year to the Santa Fe United Way.
- SFCC houses the statewide New Mexico Small Business Development Center. It is also home to the Santa Fe Small Business Development Center, which served more than 700 clients last year.
- More than 5,400 adults and school children enjoyed programs in the SFCC Planetarium last year.
- SFCC hosts more than 200 conferences, meetings, and workshops for local, state and national groups annually. Its Jemez Rooms meeting complex is one of the city's most sought-after venues for such activities.
- The SFCC Child Development Center provides top-quality childcare and education services as well as training and technical assistance to more than 1,000 clients annually.
- SFCC supports hundreds of local artists and performers by organizing exhibits and various gallery shows throughout the year.
